    1. Presentation on Opioid Crisis – Tempe Innovation Solutions (OCTIS)  
Wydale Holmes, Interim Director of Strategic Management and Innovation and Darrell Duty, Assistant Fire Chief, Tempe Fire Medical Rescue provided an overview on the presentation and provided information related to Opioids and the work of Tempe Fire Medical Rescue. Then, Rob Ferraro, Sergeant, Tempe Police Department discussed Tempe Police Department projects and programs related to Opioids. Jaronda Montano, Tempe Coalition Special Coordinator then discussed education and outreach of the rise in fentanyl use and Naloxone training across the city and in Tempe Union schools. Council Member Garlid asked about ways to get this information widespread across the community and having more city staff trained on Narcan administration. Staff responded with more social media outreach and communication to the community. Council Member Navarro asked about how to continue funding for programs discussed and if we track what happens after people overdose. Staff responded by discussing additional grants they are applying for and the tracking of people post-overdose.
