Affordable housing, historic preservation proposed for November bond election

Increasing funds for affordable housing, protecting Tempe's historic places and restoring Tempe's streets may be on the ballot this November as part of a proposed bond election. Among the considerations:

- Ensuring excellent street conditions by requesting \$180 million to restore all Tempe streets within four years at a cost of an estimated \$1.3 million per mile.
- Accelerating Tempe's affordable housing efforts and adding more housing opportunities approximately \$32 million is being requested over four years.
- Boosting Tempe's preservation efforts with approximately \$12.3 million requested to restore, maintain or purchase historic properties.

Questions regarding the November bond election will come back to Tempe City Council this month at a future Work Study Session. The City Council would need to call the election in April to have guestions on the November ballot. Get updates at tempe.gov/bond.

Sober living homes update

The Tempe City Council has approved the exploration of several new tools to address unlawful sober living homes, reduce victimization and protect neighborhoods. The tools include the creation of a general business license, an ordinance to address excessive calls for service and a new system to track problem properties.

State investigations into unlawful sober living homes have raised significant concerns regarding the health and safety of vulnerable residents and the broader Tempe community. Through a multidepartment task force convened in June 2023, Tempe has been actively working to assist state authorities, enforce all city codes and ordinances and help victims. Tempe is considering updates on code regulations that allow Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) and is seeking additional public feedback. This code sets the rules for building extra living spaces like casitas or creating separate rental units on existing properties. Right now, only a limited number of properties qualify to build ADUs, and we want to hear your thoughts on a possible code update that could expand their use. Be stormwater aware, keep Tempe's waterways clean

Stormwater can collect trash and pollutants as it flows to our waterways and parks. Use these tips to keep waterways and parks clean.

- 1. Pick up pet waste—it belongs in the trash
- 2. Keep grass clippings and leaves out of the road
- 3. Use fertilizers according to directions, and only on target areas
- 4. Wash your car on your lawn or gravel
- 5. Store chemicals under cover away from exposure to rain
