Below are updates regarding the November 5, 2024 Special Bond Election, for the week ending October 18, 2024.

Last Day to Request a Mail Ballot is October 25

The last day to request a ballot by mail for the November 5 General Election is **5 p.m. on Friday, October 25**. Voters who wish to vote by mail must submit their request by this deadline to ensure timely receipt of the ballot. Voters can visit **Request.Maricopa.Vote** or call Maricopa County Elections at (602) 506-1511 to make their request. This option provides the convenience of voting from home, allowing voters to carefully review their choices before completing and returning the ballot.

Ballot Tracking and Security in Maricopa County

Maricopa County employs comprehensive tracking and security measures for all mailed ballots. Each ballot features an intelligent mail barcode, enabling precise monitoring from



delivery to counting. Voters can track their ballots by texting "JOIN" to 628-683 or visiting **BeBallotReady.Vote**. The Office of the Recorder implements extensive security protocols throughout the ballot's journey, including transportation from post offices and onsite safeguards. These measures ensure ballot integrity, provide transparency, and reinforce voter confidence in the electoral process.

The Journey of a Mail Ballot: From Printing to Counting in Maricopa County



The Life of a Mail Ballot in Maricopa County video provides a detailed overview of the journey an early mail ballot takes from preparation to tabulation. It begins by explaining how Maricopa County uses third-party vendor Runbeck Election Services to print and assemble ballots and mail them to voters. The process involves advanced machinery that ensures accuracy, packaging, and tracking. Once voters complete and return their ballots, either by mail or drop box, Maricopa County collects and

transports the envelopes securely for signature verification.

The signature verification process compares the voter's signature on the green affidavit envelope with the signatures on file. Once verified, the ballot is separated from the envelope to ensure anonymity, and the ballot is prepared for tabulation. Bipartisan teams handle the ballots, ensuring the process is secure, auditable, and transparent. Any issues, such as unreadable ballots or overvotes, are addressed by bipartisan adjudication teams. Early ballots are tabulated before Election Day November 5 but stored securely and air-gapped until results are released on Election Night.

Late-arriving ballots and ballots that require signature curing follow the same steps, although their results may be reported later. Throughout the process, voters can track their ballot's status in real time by texting "JOIN" to 628-683.

2024 General Election Key Information for Maricopa County Voters

Voters can check out important information about Maricopa County Elections by watching the latest episode of <u>Maricopa Votes</u>. Voters can also visit <u>JustTheFacts.Vote</u> to sign up for a monthly newsletter from Maricopa County Elections and have new Maricopa Votes episodes delivered to their inbox so they stay informed about upcoming elections.

The 2024 General Election introduces several important changes and key dates for Maricopa County voters. For the first time since 2006, voters will receive a two-page ballot, printed on both sides, due to the high number of contests. Early ballots were mailed out on October 9, with most voters receiving them within days. Ballot tracking is available by texting "JOIN" to 628-683.

To prepare, voters can access their sample ballot at <u>BeBallotReady.Vote</u>. This tool allows for contest research and preparation before voting. Those not registered for mail voting will receive a physical sample ballot.

Early in-person voting began October 9, with additional Vote Centers opening throughout the month. Locations and hours can be found at <u>Locations.Maricopa.Vote</u>. For those preferring mail voting, requests can be made at <u>Request.Maricopa.Vote</u> by **5 p.m. on Friday, October 25**. The last day to mail ballots is **Tuesday, October 29**, but they can be dropped off at Vote Centers or Drop Boxes until 7 p.m. on Election Day November 5.




Engineering Division Capital Improvement Program Update

The Public Works, Engineering Division manages design and construction of the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The current 5-year CIP budget is approximately \$2 billion, and the Fiscal Year 2024/25 capital budget is \$775 million.

As of October 2024, the Engineering Division has a total of 191 active projects and 480 active contracts. Active projects are associated with 13 different funds reflecting the diversity of facility and infrastructure development and improvements managed by the Engineering Division.

City Hall Renovation

The heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) and deck replacement projects are in final closeout at City Hall. The next phases of City Hall work include Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements, new landscaping and tree removal and replacement.

Fire Medical Rescue Station No. 2


A new fire station is being constructed on the property of the existing Tempe Fire Medical Rescue Station No. 2. The new Station No. 2 facility will allow for better response from existing resources due to better functional configuration. The new Station will adequately accommodate and provide ambulance services in a manner that is not possible now due to a lack of current space.

Pavement Preservation, Victory Acres Neighborhood

The project involved pavement rehabilitation and replacement of concrete ramps to meet ADA requirements of Victory Aces Neighborhood. The pavement surface had exceeded its useful life and required a pavement preservation treatment as part of the City's asset management program.

Tempe Municipal Operation Center (TMOC)

Phase 2 is under construction to provide replacement facilities for Fleet Services and Solid Waste.

Diablo Stadium

Parking capacity was added back at Diablo Stadium which was lost due to the I-10/Broadway Curve widening project. This project also included new lighting, landscape and irrigation, a new dry well and a roundabout for a future Connector Roadway on the north side, which is currently in design.

Goodwin Park Improvements
