WaterSmart Tempe



I've recently been appointed to the Board of Directors for the Arizona Municipal Water Users Association (AMWUA) by Mayor Woods, and I'm thoroughly enjoying learning more about water management—an essential but often overlooked resource, especially in the desert.

In the October Water Conservation eNewsletter I shared my experience with a water leak and the high use alert system. This tool has proven invaluable for identifying minor issues before they escalate into major problems. Alerts have been sent out for issues such as a running toilet, a landscaping leak, and most recently, a pool leak.

For those unfamiliar with this program, read more about it and consider signing up. The WaterSmart Customer Portal, a free resource for Tempe water utility customers, allows for monitoring of hourly and daily water usage and the ability to sign up for leak and high-use alerts. For more information or to sign up, contact **Tempe Water Conservation** at 480-350-8351.

Tempe offers sustainable living workshops on creating sustainable, water-wise, and low- maintenance landscapes led by local experts. Virtual workshops are conducted live on Microsoft Teams, while in-person sessions are held at the <u>Tempe Public Library</u> unless otherwise specified.

This month's upcoming workshop is **Drip Design**, Installation, and Maintenance: Learn the essentials of designing, maintaining, troubleshooting and repairing residential drip irrigation systems. The workshop will be held from 11 a.m. to noon, Saturday, Nov. 16, 2024, at the Tempe Public Library.
