I. Background

The planned improvements to Joyce Park will include new upgraded playground equipment, expanded rubber playground surfacing, and an additional accessible picnic table location. A public meeting was held to gather feedback on the proposed playground improvements for Joyce Park from 8:30 to 9:30 a.m. on May 18 with 13 participants. Additionally, a survey was available online from May 18 – June 4, 2024. This survey received a total of 56 responses.

II. Outreach

Direct Mailer

A direct mailer was sent to residents near Joyce Park. The boundaries were Southern Avenue to the north, US60 to the south, Mill Avenue to the west, and Rural Road to the east. The direct mailer included a brief overview of the project and details on how to attend the public meeting and provide comments.

Emails

A notification email was sent to neighborhood contacts and relevant Boards and Commissions inviting them to attend the meeting or to comment online.

Yard Signs


Yard signs with meeting and comment information were placed around Joyce Park.

The project <u>webpage</u> was updated continuously and included information about the project, the date and access information for the public meeting and online comment information.






III. Survey Results

42 respondents provided an address within the project boundaries.




1. How close do you live to Joyce Park?





3. What playground layout and style would you like to see in the renovated park?



PLAYGROUND LAYOUTS & STYLE: OPTION A










4. Most of the new playground ground surface will be accessible rubber surface, some sand play area will remain. What size sand area would you like to see?

5. In the future, if funding were available for an additional amenity expansion at Joyce Park, which of the below are you **MOST** in favor of adding? Select up to 3.





7. Currently Joyce Park is open from 6 a.m. to midnight. Are you in favor of changing the park hours to close at 10 p.m.?





 - 1. Add monkey bars to plan A
 - 2. Adding more dog bags and trash cans for neighbors to pick up after pets, if future funding allows, more water fountains with lever for dog bowl at bottom (seen at other parks), the more large grass areas and trees kept the more easily neighbors can utilize the space trees are the best shade and beautify the neighborhood especially with so little green areas in Tempe neighborhoods.
