


# Daley Park Improvements Survey Results Feb. 16 – March 1, 2016

**RAMADAS BACKGROUND:** Please refer to the site map for detailed locations. Daley Park currently has 3 ramadas, which are funded for renovation and/or replacement. The two ramadas (A and B) located near the playground will be renovated. The one ramada (C) located north of the parking lot can be demolished and replaced if desired or rebuilt in a different location.

Note: The adjacent neighborhoods received a neighborhood grant to improve the asphalt area along College (location 1) to include shade, turf, game areas and seating. Neighbors have termed the area the "Dream Lot."




## 1. Ramada located north of the parking lot.


If you selected locations 2-7, please answer the following questions. If installed in location 1 (Dream Lot), the ramada would be custom designed.

a. Please indicate what size ramada you prefer.





**RESTROOM BACKGROUND:** The current traditional style restroom facility (enclosed with stalls) will be demolished and rebuilt in the same location with a facility that includes unisex units.


#### 2. Please provide comments on the new restroom facilities.

- 1. I like the idea of having unisex toilette rooms that can be locked by the user. The current location of the bathroom is somewhat challenging for parents with small children who must walk from the playground to use the bathroom (although I understand that the central location of the bathroom allows it to be used by those using the softball fields as well). Please make sure the look of the bathroom matches the personality and preferences of the neighborhood. I believe a functional design that also has the aesthetics desired by the community is possible. Graffiti has been a problem at the bathroom in the past. Finding a way to deter this without compromising the preferred aesthetic design may be a good idea. Please include soap dispensers in the design and ensure they are filled routinely by maintenance staff.
- 2. Multi-colors for doors; minimize brown-feels old; corrugated roof-good choice; clean design; door design?
- 3. Use same location (save money)
- 4. Stainless steel; visual impact and functional & maintenance
- 5. Need some
- 6. Privacy is better Unisex

- 8. Prefer unisex individual units. Use color on the doors!
- 9. Solar Panels on roofs (Ramada Top)

- 16. Make the max amount of stalls, while complying with ADA. That said, I don't feel they all need to be ADA.


#### Cleanliness of the park

#### Safety of the park


