


Dwight Park Improvements 2nd Meeting Survey Results April 7 – April 21, 2016

1. Of the three options for a Dwight Park play structure for ages 5-12, which do you prefer?

2. Why did you choose this option? Option A:

- 1. The smaller slides allow younger children to enjoy them.
- 2. Nice and tall, with lots of options for climbing and play.

- 8. I chose A because it has the large twirl slide in addition to the small straight slide. My nephew is scared of the current slide at the park so he won't go down it, and with our first child due this month, that is a big consideration for me (a slide for bigger and smaller kids).

Other


1. Why do you need a sidewalk to get to a playground? Disabled folks? Sorry.

- 9. No.


- 10. I like how the colors are not traditional playground colors. While they are bright, they're not your cliché red, yellow, etc. I like how the neutral tones compliment the area.

- 6. Here in Arizona, I would like to see both groups of play equipment and swings have shade structures. At least place the shade structure over the play equipment with the swings getting lots of shade from the placement.
