



Country Club Way Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements Project

Fact Sheet

Country Club Way Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements Project is included in the Transportation Master Plan and spans seven miles along Country Club Way between Warner Road south of ASU Research Park and Tempe Town Lake.

The project connects to several regional multi-use paths, bicycle pedestrian corridors, schools, parks and major destinations, as well as to light rail and other major transit. It could include public art, enhanced sidewalks, shared-use path and bike lanes, signalized street intersections and mid-block crossings, raised medians, railroad crossing and landscaping. The proposed project would re-characterize streets along the alignment and provide an alternative way of connecting north and south Tempe and the region.

Timeline:

April 2017: Public meetings to inform the residents about the project and gather input on potential design elements. Online comment is available from April 18 to May 9, 2017 at www.tempe.gov/countryclubwaypath

Fall 2017: Public meetings to review the final design.

Construction (if funded): 2021 or 2022

Funding:

- Maricopa Association of Governments design assistance grant: \$82,500
- Final design/environmental clearances (unfunded): \$425,000
- Estimated Construction Costs for Construction:
 - \$5 million for street improvements (unfunded)
 - \$2 million for pathway (one mile) (unfunded)
 - \$3 to 5 million for railroad crossing (unfunded)
- Tempe would be required to contribute a 5.7 percent match for construction.
