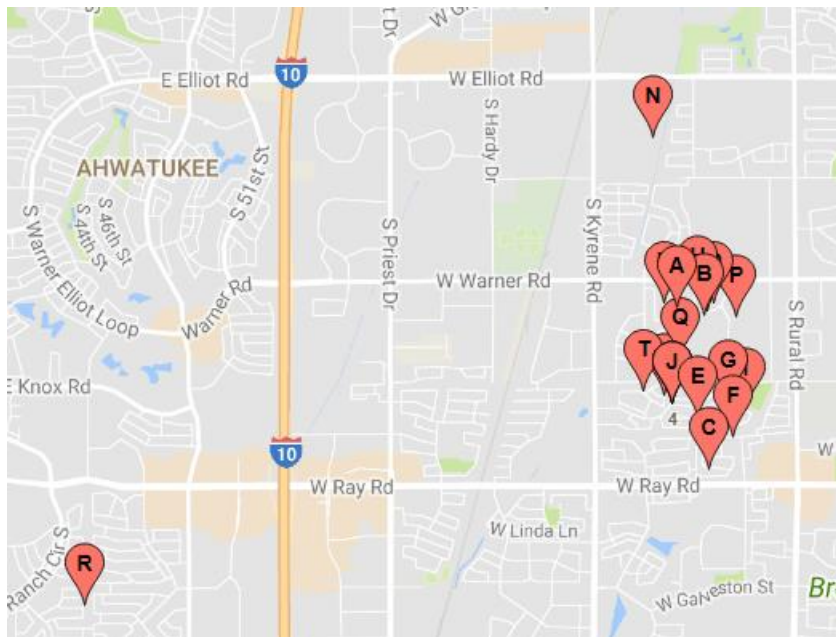




**Overview**

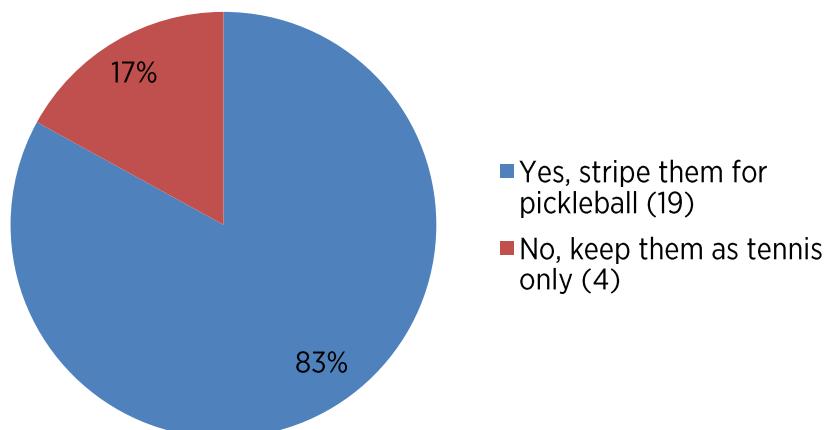
An online follow up survey was conducted from Oct. 20 to Nov. 5 to gauge interest in continuing with the direction given from the previous survey.

**Survey Responses**

1. Would you like to continue with the original desire to include pickleball lines on one of the two dedicated tennis courts, or keep the two courts tennis only? Either option includes striping for junior tennis lines.



## Additional Comments:

1. If you are not including nets it makes the most sense to stripe each court so that the existing tennis nets can be used. That way there will still be 2 courts for either tennis players or p.ball players to use on a first come/first served basis
2. With the new pickleball courts only a couple miles away, my preference is to leave the Harelson courts as tennis courts.
3. We would like the original plan to stripe for pickleball, we would like to be able to walk to the park and use the courts. It doesn't hurt to move forward with a few extra stripes.
4. We are so excited to play pickle ball in our own neighborhood! I'll bet it will be quite popular!!!
5. I'm not familiar with pickleball. It would be fine to stripe as long as it's still easy to make out the lines for tennis and not confusing.

9. Please make sure you stripe at least one court for junior/senior tennis.
10. There are no public courts within the city of Tempe, that one can play junior tennis without a fee.
11. A seasoned pickleball player will travel to the Sports Complex to play in leagues or as individuals, but newcomers to the game will likely not. Those just learning the game or have interest but not yet tried it would more likely come to the local courts nearby to try it out. I still think striping an existing tennis court would be good... But I do NOT support designating either court as pickle ball only.

13. Please count 2 votes (one for each of us) for the pickleball line on one Harelson Park tennis court. We can walk there decreasing our carbon footprint!"
14. Striping one court for pickle ball should be adequate.
15. I believe adding pickleball lines (in a less visible color than the tennis court lines) on one of the renovated tennis courts at Harelson Park will result in more residents utilizing those courts, especially those who reside within a half mile of Harelson Park. Another feature that might be considered would be to provide portable nets (that could be moved to one side during tennis play) for at least two pickleball courts, although, because these courts are public courts, vandalism might be an issue.
16. It would be nice to have the option of pickle ball in our neighborhood -- to walk to and from, rather than having to get in the car and drive to courts a few miles away.
