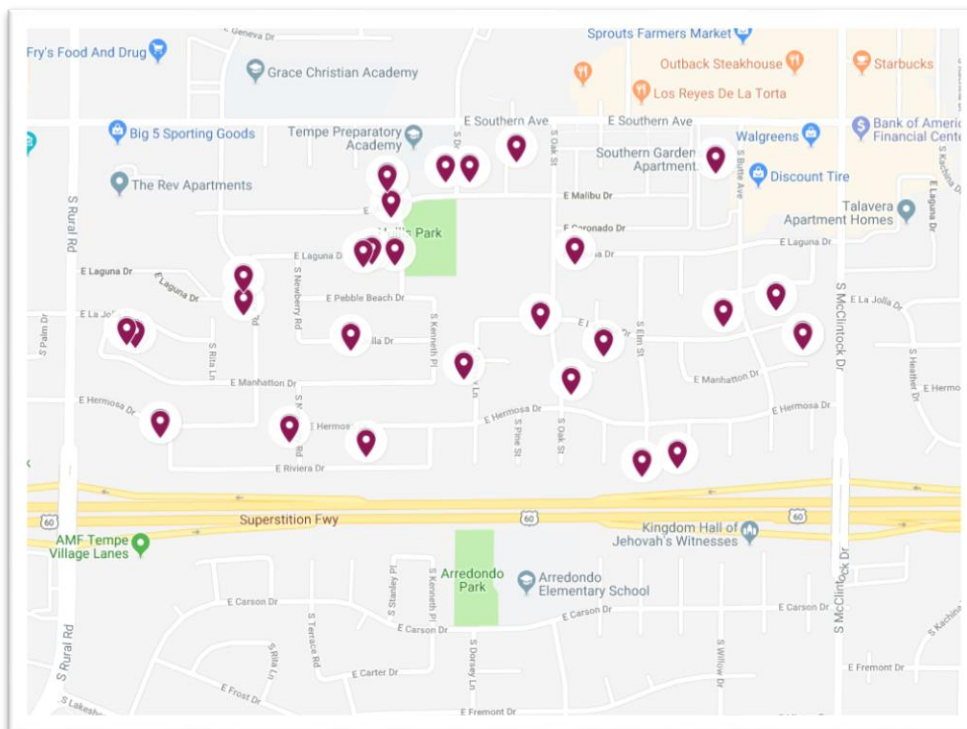


PUBLIC INPUT SUMMARY

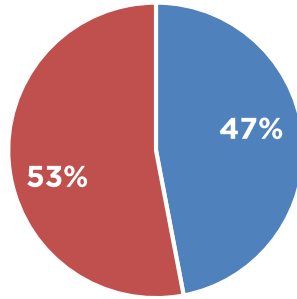
Overview

A public meeting was held on November 17, 2018 for feedback on planned improvements for Hollis Park. Residents in the area of Southern Ave. to the US 60, S McClintock Dr. to S Rural Rd. (1290 households) were invited to participate in the process via postcard. Notices were posted to Nextdoor to four neighborhoods (445 households) directing residents to both the meeting and the website. Park signs were also placed in the park announcing the meeting. Twelve (12) people signed in for the meeting in the park. Residents were asked to provide input on play structure concepts, shade structure location, ramada colors, and park hours. Surveys were available at the meetings and online from November 17, 2018 through December 1, 2018. A total of 32 survey responses were received; 9 at the meeting and 23 online, one from outside the project area.

Map of Survey Respondents

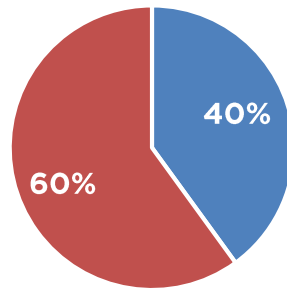


1. Improvements to the playground will include a 5-12 play structure, shade, lighting, accessible sidewalks, a refurbished picnic area, and additional trees. In addition, residents chose a modern nature-themed playground with arch swings, a fitness station, a 2-5 year-old play structure, and a web climbing feature. 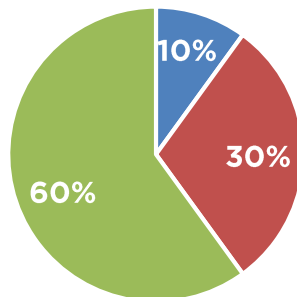
- Play Structure Concept Option B (14)

2. One shade structure will be installed, where should it be placed?



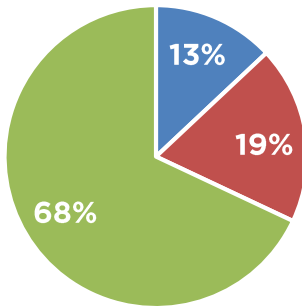
- Over the 2-5 Play Structure (11)

4. Currently your park sign states that the park is open from 6 a.m. to 12 a.m. Are you in favor of changing the posted park hours to 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.?

Additional Comments:

1. Would prefer that you avoid play items that someone can hide in. Open structures are best. I also use the current parallel bars for back stretches so I would miss this if there was nothing comparable.
2. I agree that more shade on the playground should be a priority. I would be in favor of giving up something - like more trees - in order to extend the shade area to cover both the 2-5 and 5-12 play structures. It is unreasonable to ask us to pick one group of kids that get shade. Please don't install a playground that has no slides!
3. Will the rubber surfacing on the playground be non-toxic? Will it meet the standards for head injuries? <http://stopcancerfund.org/pz-environmental-exposures/caution-children-at-play-on-potentially-toxic-surfaces>. I know other folks have asked - can we have a space for a community garden? A pickle ball court?
4. Please leave the bathrooms.
5. Please place the shade structure wherever it will provide the most shade.
6. Cover the most items possible with the shade structure
7. While we would prefer Option B, a big slide would be nice.
8. Put the shade structure over the largest area possible/most shade possible. Extra funds toward shading playground area fully, including grants. Thank you for including multi-age options.
9. I think the space for a fitness thing is being wasted and could be used for another kid-friendly thing. I think there should be a couple sidewalk-style access from the school parking lot (maybe this would limit cars driving to the ramada) I would like MORE information about the private security that will be watching our park.

11. Please use a grant to shade as much of the playground as possible. Please help with security at our park.

12. Both the playgrounds look great. Please plan the most shade possible, I don't care where it goes. Don't care about ramada colors. Thanks for doing this! I just want shade for the kids and parents, and a comfortable place to sit for parents. Every play structure has ups and downs, we'll be happy whatever you do!
