

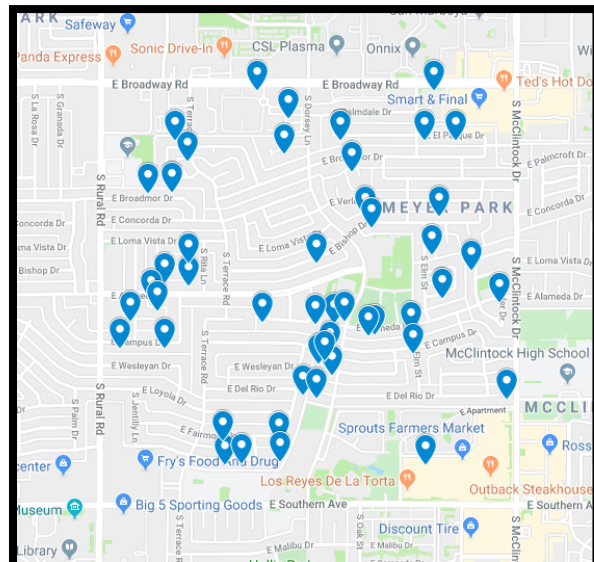
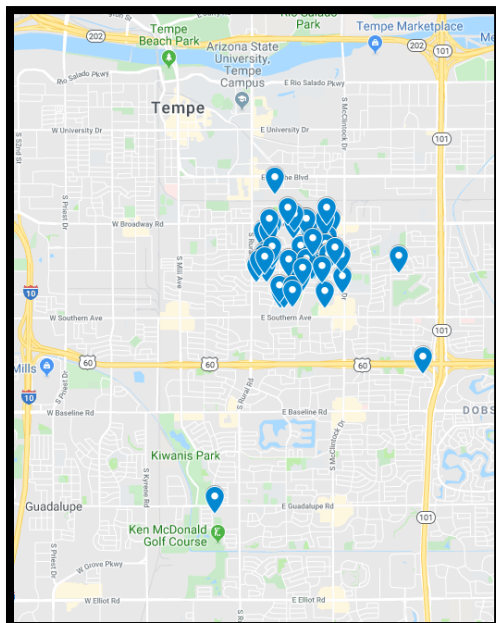


PUBLIC INPUT SUMMARY

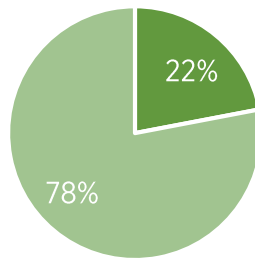
Overview

A public meeting was held on November 16, 2019 for feedback on planned improvements for Meyer Park. Residents in the area of Broadway Rd. to Southern Ave., McClintock Rd. to Rural Rd. (2527 households) were invited to participate in the process via postcard. Notices were posted to Nextdoor to 1189 households directing residents to both the meeting and the website. Signs were also placed in the park announcing the meeting. Ten people signed in for the meeting in the park. Residents were asked to provide input on playground equipment layout, shade structure locations, playground color palette and ramada roof color. Surveys were available at the meetings and online from November 16 through November 30, 2019. A total of 57 survey responses were received; 7 at the meeting and 50 online, 4 from outside the project area.

■ Playground Layout "B" (12) ■ **Playground Layout "A" (42)**

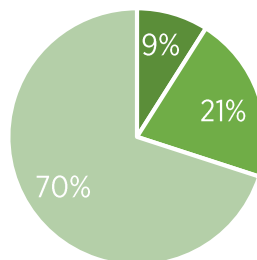
2. Two shade structures will be installed, please rank the following location options (where 1 is your most preferred choice and 3 is your last choice)

2nd Choice – **Over the 5-12 play structure**, with 53% of the 2nd choice vote

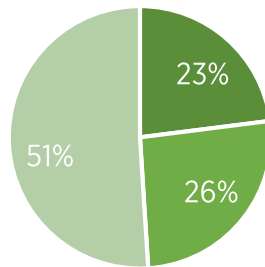
3rd Choice – Over the swings, with 79% of the 3rd choice vote

Additional Comments:

17. Please have both play structures shaded! Also A combo swing for parents/infants!
18. Please include large shade structures like the present layout. Please include baby swings, as these are frequently utilized. Finally, please install comfortable benches for parents under the shade or shaded tree. Rubber instead of sand is preferred as well.
19. Restrooms would be nice! Jenna likes lots of monkey bars!
20. Shade structure over playground needs to be at least twice as large as pictured otherwise will only cover equipment at only high noon.
