

# TYPES OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT

**SEND YOUR FAFSA TO 4-YEAR UNIVERSITIES, COMMUNITY COLLEGES AND TRADE SCHOOLS!**

## PELL GRANT

- Complete and submit student FAFSA. *Student must have a Social Security Number.*
- The maximum award is \$6,495 but can vary depending on EFC, Expected Family Contribution.
- Renewable every school year up to 6 years, when financial need is present.
- Registered as a full-time or part-time student
- Unlike a loan, does not have to be repaid, except under certain circumstances.

## WORK STUDY

- Complete and submit student FAFSA. *Student must have a Social Security Number.*
- Paid part-time employment, 8-15 hours.
- In the FAFSA application, students must select they are interested in being considered for work-study.
- Work-Study offer will be present on the Financial Aid Award Letter if accepted by the institution.
- The student is responsible for finding their job at the institution. Recommend connecting to cultural and resources centers to search for positions.

## PAYMENT PLANS

- Set up payment plans with the Bursar office at the institution.
- Amounts and payment timelines can vary by institution.
- Commonly institutions have students pay in full any charges to their account by the end of the semester in order to register for classes the following semester.

## LOANS: SUBSIDIZED VS. UNSUBSIDIZED

- Complete and submit student FAFSA. *Student must have a Social Security Number.*
- Money from loans can go towards purchasing a computer, backpack, books, other supplies, and extra materials.
- Pay back loans after graduation.
- **Subsidized:** Interest starts to accrue 6 months after graduation.
- **Unsubsidized:** Interest starts to accrue after loans are accepted.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

- **Academic-based scholarships** are awarded to students due to their GPA, grades, or SAT/ACT scores.
- **Need-based scholarships** are awarded due to high financial needs which can be determined by your Free Application for Federal Student Aid, FAFSA.
- **Interests based scholarships** are awarded for specific interests, topics, and methods. For example photography, community leadership, or creating duct tape attire!
