Subject: Agenda Item #3, Introduction of New Members

The April Historic Preservation Commission meeting is the first for two new Commission members:

- David (Dave) Fackler has resided in Tempe for 43 years. He is serving on the HPC as Professional Member—Architecture. Mr. Fackler worked for the City of Tempe for 21 years, including as the director of the Development Services Department (now the Community Development Department). In his various roles, he “helped guide the first 25 years of the initial establishment and implementation of the Downtown, Victory Acres, North Tempe, Rio Salado and Apache Blvd. Redevelopment Areas.” Since retiring from the City, he has led his own planning and development firm. His desire to serve on a City commission is driven by his desire, he notes, “to help guide the continued development, revitalization, preservation and redevelopment of the best planned and developed community in the State.”
- Kiyomi Kurooka has resided in Tempe for 32 years. She is a registered architect, and she is serving on the HPC as Professional Member—Architecture. Her previous service to the City of Tempe includes stints on the Municipal Arts Commission, Neighborhood Advisory Commission, and Transit Shelter Design Steering Committee. In her application, Ms. Kurooka stated that she “can recognize aesthetically significant designs/properties,” “can advise improvements on proposed designs,” and “ha[s] knowledge in construction materials and methods.”
