City Council Direction, cont.



- Ad Hoc Committee Charge:
 - Recommend new names for impacted streets and parks to City Manager
- Ad Hoc Committee should provide information and take public recommendations via online portal
- Ad Hoc Committee should coordinate efforts with Tempe Elementary School District as applicable/appropriate

City Council Direction, cont.



- Ad Hoc Committee should consider landmarks as potential new names
- Ad Hoc Committee should make recommendations for reimbursing residents and businesses for costs associated with street name changes
 - City Staff to assist with these efforts
