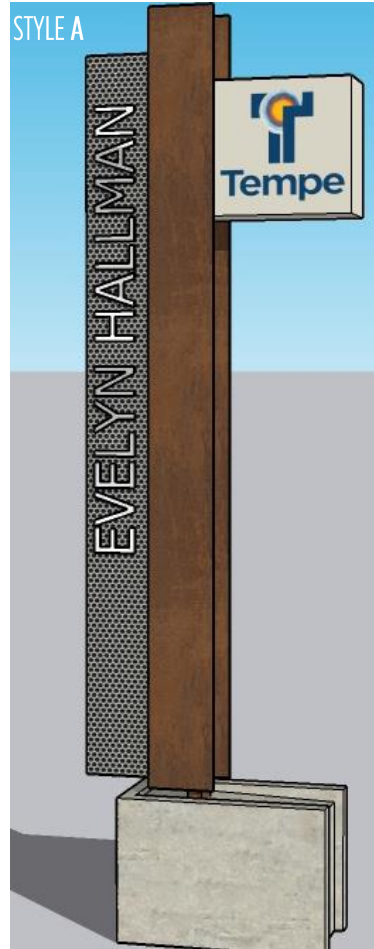
Vertical Signs

- Perforated Steel Name Plate Structure
- Concrete Base
- Rusted Solid Steel I-Beam Center
- Single Accent Panel with Tempe Logo

Style B Features: Gabion Base and Solid Steel

- Etched Solid Stainless Steel Name Plate Structure
- Gabion Basket Base Filled with Stone
- Rusted Solid Steel I-Beam
- Accent Panel with Tempe Logo
- Additional Color Accent Information Panel

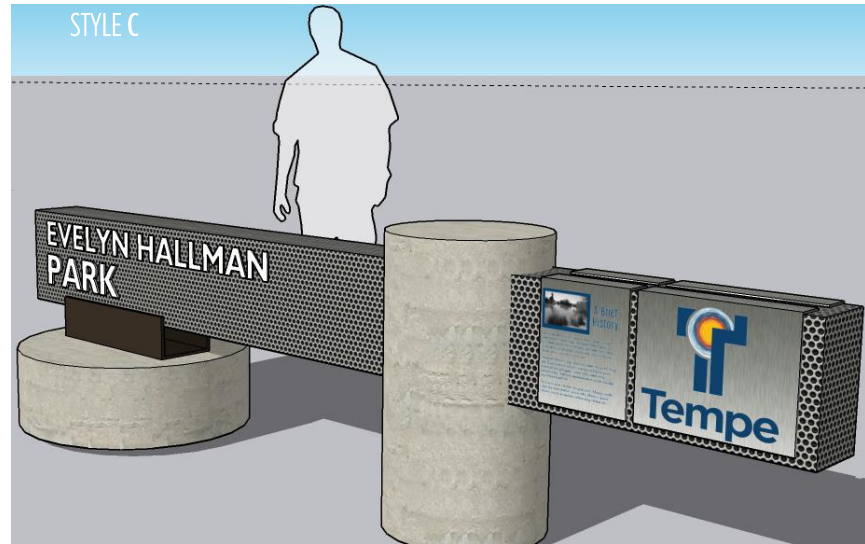


Horizontal Signs

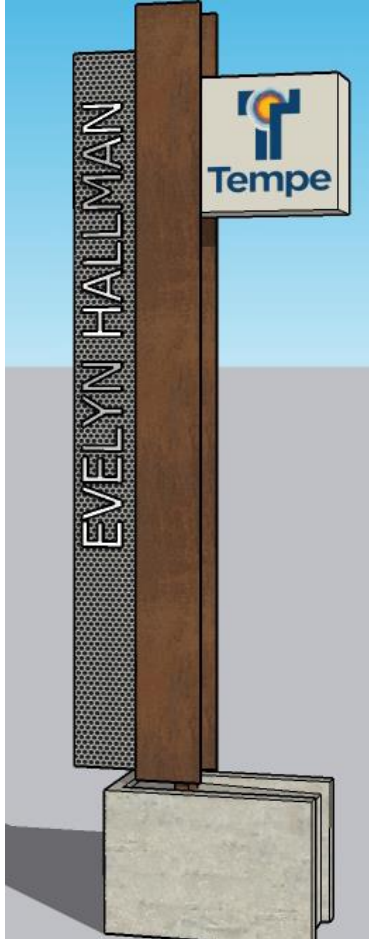

Concrete Base Perforated Sign

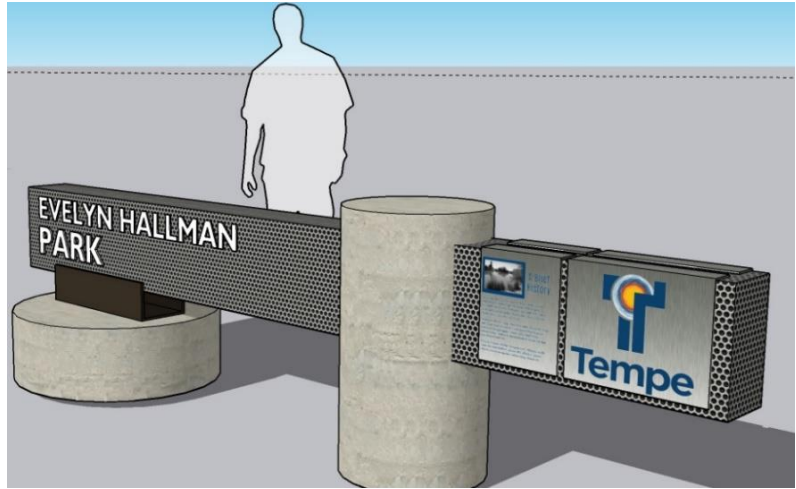
